Have 5 Safe Houses: Kentucky, Nevada, Ohio, Texas and Illinois but serve women across the country. This is a long term (9 month) residential program. The program pays all expenses once a woman has arrived at a Safe House: food, clothing, toiletries, medical services, therapy, etc.

To be considered, the woman must send in an online application from the website and someone will get back to her within 48 business hours. She will be interviewed by phone several times and it usually takes a couple of weeks for everything to be processed. For safety reasons, the woman is always accepted to a Safe House in another state. She must pay her own travel expenses to get to the Safe House but once there, everything is provided.

Accepts women 18 years and up, no children can be at the Safe House. If addicted, the applicant must be clean for 30 days.
